This can be seen through positive handling of unwanted student behavior, showing enthusiasm in teaching, giving a friendly smile, having good emotional control, and being able to act proportionally so that the teacher's personal problems can be handled appropriately.
- 4. Provide understanding to students that the purpose of learning is to achieve proud achievements, make it easier to get a job, fulfill the desire to make parents proud, or as a form of worship to God, and various other reasons that can be a motivation to develop students' interest in learning.
- 5. Active involvement of students is very important, because interest in learning should be able to develop internally from students' efforts in learning, either with or without help from other people. This can be achieved through understanding that the learning process has many benefits for one's development.

From the results of these interviews, there are several roles that teachers can play in fostering student learning motivation. First, create a learning atmosphere that is fun and interesting for students. Teachers must strive to create a sense of comfort for students, which is the most important thing.
